Please use dashes and hyphens correctly (–or — for a dash, - for a hyphen). Do not worry about page numbering; we will take care of it.
Author's name	font: 14 pt centered line spacing: single spacing after: 18 pt	Your name comes at the beginning of your document, above your essay's title.
Essay title	font: 18 pt, bold centered line spacing: single spacing before: 0 pt; after: 30 pt	
Heading (1. etc.)	font: 16 pt, bold line spacing: single spacing before: 24 pt; after: 12 pt	
Subheading (1.1 etc.)	font: 14 pt, not bold line spacing: single spacing before: 18 pt; after: 6pt	
Long quotations (more than 4 lines)	font: 12 pt line spacing: single indentation: 1 cm (complete quotation, not just the first line) spacing before and after: 6 pt	Do not put quotation marks around block quotes.
Latin text	font: italics	In quotations and running text.
Greek text	font: any Unicode font, NO italics!	In quotations and running text. Please don't use other fonts or italics; otherwise we will have trouble converting.
Footnotes	font: 12 pt line spacing: single indentation: hanging, 1 cm spacing after: 3 pt	Please start the first line of each footnote with a 1 cm tabstop so as to make it justify with the rest of the footnote text. Bibliographical references in footnotes: see p. 2, below.
Footnote number in running text	font: 12 pt, superscript!	
Footnote number in footnote	font: 12 pt, NO superscript!	We are afraid that the 'superscript' format in footnotes can only be removed by hand or macro.

Basic formatting	<p>If there is more than one author, editor, or place of publication, separate them with slashes (no blanks in between).</p> <p>End all references with a full stop. No "pp." before page numbers. Publishers are referred to as "ed.,"/"eds." or "Hg.,"/"Hgg." "Volume(s)" is abbreviated "vol.,"/"vols." Use a hyphen, not a dash, with page numbers (x-y, not x–y). In English titles, all 'content words' begin with capital letters.</p>	<p>ex.: Wehrli, F./Wöhrle, G./Zmund. L. W.W. Fortenbaugh/E. Schütrumpf (eds.)... ... London/New York 2008.</p>
Monograph	Name, first name (abbreviated), title, place(s) and year of publication (no comma in between), no number of pages.	ex.: Bonhöffer, A., Die Ethik des Stoikers Epictet, Stuttgart 1894.
Journal	Name, first name (abbreviated; more than one first names are not separated by a blank), title of article, name of journal (common abbreviation possible) number (no comma in between), year of publication, pages.	ex.: Rist, J.M., Zeno and Stoic Consistency, Phronesis 22, 1977, 161-174.
Anthology	Name, first name, title of essay, in: name of publisher, title of anthology, volume (and if indicated, volume title after a colon), place(s) and year of publication (no comma in between), pages.	ex.: Steinmetz, P., Die Stoa, in: H. Flashar (Hg.), Die Philosophie der Antike, Bd. 4: Die hellenistische Philosophie, Basel 1994, 491-716.
References in footnotes	Name (year) page number (no comma in between).	ex.: Rist (1977) 167.
